Scholarship UNESCO Chair "Culture and Traditions of Wines" of the University of Burgundy

Open for the academic year 2017-2018

In accordance with the University of Burgundy's international policy, we are offering one scholarship for a second year master student who is studying within the theme of "Culture and Traditions of Wines" as proposed by the UNESCO chair at the University of Burgundy.

Scholarship Value: 10 000 €

Eligibility:

- **Foreign citizen**
- Have at minimum a level C1 for French language if studying law, economics, management, Economic and Social Administration (AES) or Life, earth and the Environmental Sciences (SVTE); level B2 French language required for all other disciplines
- Successfully completed first year of Master's degree or equivalent
- be enrolled for the 2016-2017 academic year at an eligible university specified by the UNESCO Chair "Culture and Traditions of Wines" ([link to the list](#))
- The Master 2 thesis subject should be related to themes of "Culture and Traditions of Wines"

Terms and Conditions

- The scholarship winner will also be exempt from paying tuition fees to the University of Burgundy
- However the scholarship winner must pay his insurance and civil liability insurance fees

Key date Guidelines

To be considered for a scholarship, the applicant must complete the following two-step process:

1) Complete and submit online application at the University of Burgundy

Applicants who are residents of a Campus France country with a CEF procedure (Algeria, Argentina, Benin, Brazil, Burkina Faso, Cameroun, Chile, China, Colombia, Comoros, Congo Brazzaville, Korea Côte d'Ivoire, Egypt, United States of America, Gabon, Guinea, India, Indonesia, Iran, Japan, Lebanon, Madagascar, Mali, Morocco, Mauritius, Mauritania, Mexico, Peru, Russia, Senegal, Syria, Taiwan, Togo, Tunisia, Turkey, Vietnam)

Applicants must create an account with [Campus France](#) of their country and submit the application, before 31st March 2017.

Applicants **who live in France or in a country without a Campus France CEF procedure (see Campus France website)** need to apply directly on the [University of Burgundy's website](#). They can apply from February 2017 and must specify that they are applying for the UNESCO Chair "Culture and Traditions of Wines" scholarship.

2) After submitting your application to the University of Burgundy's International Office or to Campus France, you must submit your application for the Excellence Scholarship to the UNESCO Chair "Culture and Traditions of Wine";

Required documents for application:

- Curriculum vitae
- Copy and a certified translation of all degrees
- Motivational letter in French
- Presentation of research topic (two pages maximum)
- Recommendation letter(s)
- Proficiency of French language certificate *TCF B2* or a French language degree *DELF B2* for the disciplines requiring level B2 and *TCF C1* or *DALF C1* or C2 for disciplines requiring C1 level ⁽¹⁾
- Any other documents that could strengthen the application
