The Hambacher Fest of 1832 constituted the first democratic movements in Germany, France, Poland and other European countries. Thus Hambach Castle has become the symbol of German and European democracy. Here we want to come together to support a strong and democratic Europe.

We invite young people from Rhineland-Palatinate, Saarland and other European regions to share their ideas and views for a just and sustainable policy framework for Europe.

You are between 20 and 35 years old and interested in Europe?

This workshop is your opportunity to meet new people, exchange ideas and develop concrete proposals to enhance European policies and institutions and to strengthen the resilience of democracy in Europe. The workshop is followed by a conference where you can present your ideas and perspectives to a group of European parlamentarians, national politicians, democracy experts and representatives of European civil society. A unique opportunity to discuss face to face with decision-makers and provide them with a list of »to do's« for their work.

The Hambach Democracy Dialogues (HDD) are intended to be a platform for exchanging progressive ideas and proposals for further developing European democracies.

This year, we want to refer to the Impact of Economic Turbulences on Democracy's Resilience

The crisis of the past year has strongly reinforced existing fears about one's economic future. Often, existing inequalities have been exacerbated. Inequality leads to a lack of representation of less privileged groups, the dwindling trust in democratic institutions and the decreasing political participation of many citizens. These challenges are often exploited by illiberal forces for their particular interests at the expense of democracy.

You will work about the following key questions: How inequality affects democratic participation and what can be done about it? How rich private actors disproportionally influence democratic decision making and what can be done about it? Do democratic innovations fare better in breaking the link between inequality and democracy?
